Presorted Standard

General Trash/Recycling Collection Information

- Please place your trash, single stream recycling, and/or yard materials at your designated area after 6:00 p.m. the night before collection.
- Put your address on both containers and lids to increase chance of return.
- Trash and recyclables must not be set out for recycling collection in any container, box, or bundle that has a color associated with medical or hazardous wastes (red, pink, or yellow).

Trash Can Regulations

(non-compliance could result in non-collection of material and/or injury to a collection worker)

- Maximum filled weight for a trash can is 40 pounds.
- Maximum capacity for a trash can is 34 gallons.
- Lids must fit snugly, but <u>must not</u> be fastened to the can with rope, wire, chains, etc.
- Cans with hinged lids and/or wheels are not recommended (due to difficulty in handling by collectors, and the lids/wheels being prone to breakage).

Collection Holidays

(New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas)

Trash and single stream recycling are not collected on these days and drop-off centers are closed. Makeup collections for trash and yard materials are shown on the collection schedule; single stream recycling collections are skipped until the next scheduled recycling collection.

During weeks with collection holidays, there may be delays of a day or more in <u>scheduled pickups – please leave materials out until collection occurs.</u>

Inclement Weather

(when collection does not occur on a scheduled day)

- Trash or yard materials leave items out; pickup will occur when conditions permit.
- Single stream recycling bring items back and hold until the next scheduled recycling collection or use a drop-off center.

Residential Recyclables: Baltimore County residents may take their paper and bottles & cans (no plastic bags), antifreeze, electronics, household appliances, motor oil, passenger tires (up to 4 per visit; clean and off the rim), scrap metal, and vehicle and boat batteries to the centers above for recycling.

Residential Trash: In general, Baltimore County residents in non-commercial vehicles may take up to 2 loads of trash per week (maximum 6 loads per year) from their homes in a car, SUV, minivan, or pickup truck (bed of 4'x 8' or less) to the centers above for free disposal without prior authorization. Otherwise, call 410-887-2000 for a disposal authorization at least 10 working days in advance of the date you want to drop off your materials.





Recycling Made Easy - Single Stream Recycling Information

New materials accepted in single stream recycling program are highlighted in green!

WE COLLECT:

Caps, labels, lids, and rings OK for collection!

WE DON'T COLLECT:







Aluminum and steel food and beverage cans, EMPTY aerosol cans, aluminum foil and pie pans



Propane cylinders, pots and pans, scrap metal







All colors of glass bottles and jars



Dishes, ceramics, drinking glasses, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, crystal, cookware (such as CorningwareTM, Pyrex[®])







Narrow-neck plastic bottles and jugs (with a to to to recycling symbol), wide-mouth plastic containers (such as butter, cottage cheese, peanut butter, and yogurt containers), rigid plastics (such as buckets, drinking cups, and flower pots)



Plastic bags, Styrofoam[™], clam shells (such as packaging for toys, batteries), CD jewel cases, motor oil containers, VHS tapes, plastic electronics



PAPER & CARDBOARD



Newspapers (including all inserts), magazines, phone books, catalogs, books, writing and computer paper, mail, paperboard (such as cereal, frozen food, and shoe boxes), cardboard (flattened), milk and juice cartons/boxes



Paper or cardboard covered by wax, plastic, or food; Kleenex[®]; foil gift wrap

Single Stream Collection Regulations

- Recyclables may be mixed together and set out for recycling collection in a variety of containers, including:
 - recycling containers up to 34 gallon capacity;
 - trash containers up to 34 gallon capacity used only for recycling (marked with a large "X" or "RECYCLE"); or
 - small cardboard boxes (boxes collected with contents).
- Paper and cardboard may also be tied in bundles with non-plastic string or placed in paper bags for collection.
- Containers are limited to a maximum filled weight of <u>40 pounds</u>. Boxes, bundles, and bags are limited to a maximum filled weight of <u>30 pounds</u>.
- If the container has a lid, the lid <u>must not</u> be fastened to the container with rope, wire, chains, etc.
- Containers with hinged lids and/or wheels are not recommended (due to difficulty in handling by collectors, and the lids/wheels being prone to breakage).
- Recyclables <u>must not</u> be set out for recycling collection in <u>plastic bags of any type or color</u> (plastic bags <u>will not</u> be collected in order to prevent processing complications at the "single stream" recycling sorting facility).





Yard Materials Collection

We Collect: Grass, leaves, vines, twigs, shrubbery trimmings, and branches and limbs

<u>We Don't Collect:</u> Poison ivy, oak, or sumac; giant hogweed, lumber, food scraps, garden hose, etc.

<u>Collection Note:</u> If and when there is a Y on your schedule (check 4/1-12/14), yard materials will be collected separately for recycling and will not be collected with trash. If and when there is no Y on your schedule, yard materials may be placed out for trash collection.

• Place grass and leaves in paper (preferred) or plastic lawn and leaf bags. Branches and limbs must be no larger than 3 inches in diameter, no longer than 3 feet, and tied in bundles. Bag or bundle other materials. Maximum weight for a bag or bundle is 30 pounds. Do not place yard materials in trash containers or the street.
